DSC has been undergoing a great deal of positive change over the past few years as we steer our programs to greater levels of services taking place in the community. With an organization the size of DSC, it takes a bit of time to turn this tide,

especially if you want to do it correctly - giving everyone, the people receiving the services and those offering the support, the time and support they need to make such significant changes successful. We are excited to share one of our next big steps! In accordance with the Department of Human Services, our Developmental Training program has officially been changed to **Community Day Services (CDS)**.

The change in the name of the program more accurately reflects where the work and support are taking place and provides for better understanding for those looking into the programs that DSC offers. This change was not in name only, but also includes structural and leadership changes to guide the program.

In order to support the new CDS program in continuing to expand community opportunities, we have added to the responsibilities of a few existing positions within the program. These changes will better support staff as services are offered in more diverse locations throughout our community.

In addition to providing services from locations in Champaign, DSC has recently leased space on Philo Road in Urbana. This new space offers a nice location that will allow for new experiences to take place within our broader community (See picture above). Some volunteer opportunities will be expanded and more easily accessed offering more opportunities to more people.

We are very excited about these positive changes and are eager to witness the next phase of development for Community Day Services. Please join us in celebrating this significant step!
