What is Case Management and Family Support?

DSC Case Management/Family Support Services (CM/FSS) provides a full range of services to children and adults with developmental disabilities. Each individual works with a Case Coordinator to individualize plans and support. As the single point of contact for each individual, the CM/FSS staff is responsible for coordinating the collaboration of agency and community service providers.

All Case Management staff members are required to complete Direct Support Person (DSP) training, encompassing both classroom and 120 hours of supervised in-the-job training.
