Who may be served?

 Any individual with a developmental disability, who meets the eligibility requirements of this specific program

Is there a fee?

• Individuals served through a 24hour CILA pay rent as determined by the Illinois Department of Human Services

How long can someone live in a CILA?

 An adult can live in a CILA until they have gained the necessary skills for the next step of independent living, or when an individual will require life-long 24hour support due to their disability, living in a CILA longterm is possible

Overview of Group Homes (CILA)

The Community Integrated Living Arrangement (CILA) provides supports and services 24 hours per day to eight or fewer adults in a family style setting.

The CILA provides an opportunity for individuals who require ongoing supervision and support to live more independently in the community.

DSC operates seven CILA's throughout Champaign County, providing homes and services to 47 adults living in our community.





Intermittent CILA

DSC's Intermittent CILA provides up to 15 hours of support per week to individuals residing either with family members or in their own home.

The Intermittent CILA is designed to offer individualized support to each person in the specific ways that enable them to live as independently as possible.

All Residential Staff Members are required to complete Direct Service Professional (DSP) training and receive on -going training as necessary.

Training encompasses both classroom education and an on-the-job supervised training period.

DSC's Residential Services offers and array of community-based residential options to promote independence.

CILA's Provide 24 hour support and services to eight or fewer adults in a family style group home.
